## **SCOTIABANK COMMUNITY RESEARCH INTERNSHIP FOR STUDIES IN VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN AND CHILDREN**

### **PURPOSE AND ELIGIBILITY**

#### **The Centre and Its Mandate**

The Centre for Research & Education on Violence against Women and Children is a collaborative venture between university, college and community members, which serves local and national communities, by producing useful research and resources to assist in the daily work to end violence against women and children. The Centre also develops and facilitates action research aimed at developing solutions to the systemic problem of violence.

The Centre's mandate is:

“To promote the development of action-oriented, community centered research that is based on a feminist analysis of violence against women and children. The Centre's role is to facilitate individuals, groups and institutions representing the diversity of the community to pursue research questions and training opportunities related to the understanding and prevention of abuse.”

#### **Purpose of the Scotiabank Community Research Internships**

- Demonstrate the capacity to provide a supportive environment where a student intern can learn and develop skills and expertise, while contributing to work aimed at ending violence against women and children.
